

DOTC QUESTION

The answer to last month's question was d. Remember a coulomb (like a farad) is a very large unit and in radio it would be most unusual to have a charge of more than 1 coulomb even in the largest linear power supply. The formulae is Q = C * E. Where Q is the charge in coulombs, c is the capacitance in farads and e the applied EMF volts. Therefore, Q = 10,000 * 10-6 * 50 = .5

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir/Madam,

Recently (last year) I happened to attend a reunion of some of the descendants of my great grandfather. Since that occasion, a cousin of mine (who did all the organising) has been keeping a diary/album/notebook of all events, present and past, concern my ancestors and their offspring. A week or two ago I was up that way again and on reading the album, came across this story.

First Wireless in the District

Grandfather Colless (Will A.) owned the first wireless to come into the district (Come By Chance, 80km north of Coonamble in the state's North West) in mid 1930. A friend of his, Walter Logan, travelled from Sydney to deliver it in time for the district to gather and listen to the cricket test in England, which went on into the early hours of the morning. Noel (my cousin, once or twice removed on my mothers side, I hope) still remembers the scene of everyone gathered around this box with it's knobs and a huge speaker on top - they were like bees around a honey pot. A week later the wireless broke down. This friend (Walter Logan, he was a mechanic in Arnott's biscuit factory) set off, with his wife and two sons, from Ashfield on Saturday at 1pm, after work. There were no bitumen roads beyond Penrith He arrived, fixed the wireless and left for home after lunch on Sunday to return to Sydney. He was back at work on time on Monday morning. The round trip was 900 miles.
